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1) NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminars

NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminars (NIDAS) – A complete Malayalam webinar series that addresses the concerns and queries of the Persons with Disability, their parents and caretakers on the management and implications of disability. The project was initiated on 30th October 2015, is supported and funded by the Directorate of Social Justice, Government of Kerala. NIDAS webinars are conducted on the third Saturday of every month at NISH and are simultaneously received across the 14 DCPU centres across Kerala. The sessions are held on the disabilities mentioned in the RPWD Act 2016, and their rehabilitation, by the subject experts. The team encourages participation through the inclusion of grass root level organisations, government field staff, NGOs and other institutions working in the field of Disability etc. the active interaction between the participants and the resource person depicts the success and effectiveness of the project. Such participation ensures creating a better atmosphere for differently-abled individuals, it also creates a platform for projecting the challenges faced by them in their day to day environment and highlighting the need of policymakers to execute necessary measures.

NIDAS presently is conducted in Malayalam to serve the population of Kerala or individuals exposed and familiar with the Malayalam language.

Monthly webinar being conducted at NISH that can be made available in real-time using a readily available broadband connection and common home computers. The experts conducting the workshop will speak to the audience present at NISH, and simultaneously the information will be made available on the internet using the Microsoft Lync software (Skype for Business) over a broadband internet connection. All those who are provided with the link to the web seminar can connect. This means that virtually anybody around the world with the authentication can log in to the web seminar. The collaborating features of the Lync software will provide the ability to interact with the speaker during the web seminar. The software technology currently has a limitation of 100 participants per session and also reliable bandwidth and connection will be required to implement the same effectively.

The video streamed through the connection to the web seminar can be projected onto a screen at the DCPO for a large audience to watch and interact. This will be the closest experience to participating physically in the seminar. A facility should be provided for the public to be seated comfortably, watch and participate. This arrangement will make the web seminar accessible to the general public who don't have access to higher technology in their homes. This could be a seminar hall or a conference hall. The capacity cannot be predicted and may vary depending on the topic.

For reaching out the maximum people and make available the resources, the team has initiated to develop of a NIDAS web portal and mobile application, where all the proceeding of each webinar including the upcoming NIDAS, previous NIDAS, topic, details of the subject expert, abstract, FAQ, Vocational Paper (VOC), Videos of the corresponding webinar is being uploaded in the site and app. The general public can easily access this information. To serve the population of persons with visual impairment, a Screen reader is also attached to the site.

Activity Report 2016-17

NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminar (NIDAS)

The project was initiated on 30th October 2015, is supported and funded by Directorate of Social Justice & Empowerment, Kerala, as a result of letter received from a mother of a differently abled child from rural Kasaragode. NIDAS webinars are being conducted on the third Saturdays of every month at NISH, and is simultaneously received across the 14 DCPU centres across Kerala, for now.

The sessions are held on the disabilities mentioned in the RPWD Act 2016, and their rehabilitation, by the subject experts. We encourage the participation through the inclusion of grass root level organisations, government field staffs, etc. Apart from the participants present at NISH and NIDAS centres at district levels, individual participate in it via append/or from their PCs and Smartphones. Such participation ensures creating a better atmosphere for individuals who are differently abled, it also creates a platform for projecting the challenges faced by them in their day to day environment and highlighting the need of policy makers to execute necessary measures. NIDAS presently is conducted in Malayalam to serve the population of Kerala or individuals exposed and familiar with Malayalam language.

With the financial support of Social Justice Directorate and technical support of KELTRON, we have installed hardwares required in the District Child Protection Units of 14 districts and in NISH.

SJD has provided an amount of Rs. 76,21,729.00 for NIDAS functioning, of which we have an unspent balance of Rs. 2,99,633.63 (including the Bank Interest).

Activity Report 2017-18

NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminar (NIDAS)

NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminar (NIDAS) which was launched on 30th October 2015, is supported and funded by Directorate of Social Justice, Government of Kerala, as a result of letter received from Ms Beena, a mother of a differently abled child from rural Kasaragod. NIDAS webinars are being conducted in Malayalam language on every third Saturday of the month at NISH, and is simultaneously webcasted at 14 DCPU centres across Kerala, for now.The sessions are held on different disabilities mentioned in the RPWD Act 2016, and their rehabilitation, by the subject experts.

In the year 2017- 18 the team has organised 12 NIDAS sessions on different topics. The sessions were conducted by practitioners and subject experts from medical, clinical, psychiatric fields. Shri. P.B. Nooh, Former Director, SJD addressed the participants of 27th NIDAS session on 20th January 2018 from his office. He mentioned about the significance of this kind of programmes in our society. A total of 919 participants attended the sessions during the period of 2017-18. The list of sessions are included in Annexure-1.

NIDAS team has made visit to 9 District Child Protection Units (DCPU) except Pathanamthitta, Kollam, Idukki, Ernakulam and Thiruvananthapuram with the objectives of sensitising the DCPO team on disability, motivating them to take up more effort for NIDAS sessions. We had healthy interaction with the team and they have shared their concerns and made suggestions for the effective implementation of the programme. Technical training was also offered during the visit. The NIDAS equipment were tested by NIDAS Technical Expert.

Apart from DCPU visit, NIDAS team also visited Ms Beena. The NIDAS team has interacted with the parent and they have also made visit to Deen Dayal buds, Rehabilitation Centre, Uliyathadaka, Kasaragod to Identify most common behavioural problems of children with various disabilities. They met 23 parents and a study was conducted among them. Insights gained from the study is given as Annexure-2.

NIDAS project has received amount of Rs. 2,000,000 for the year 2017-18 for its operation and have spent the amount of Rs. 786,294.92.

Identified the major behavioural problems of children with disability

General Observations

- The institute is accomodating 40 children
- Only 2 staffs are there to manage 40 children with different disabilities.
- Lack of infrastructure facilities resulted less development in the children's condition
- The families belong to low economic strata. They have been struggling to meet the medical/ psychological aids for their children, even though they all are receiving disability pension.
- Most of the children were suffering with multiple disabilities such as ID-hearing impairment, ID- Blindness, ID-locomotor disability.
- The parents are unaware about Early intervention process and the centres available in their locality.

Common Behavioural problems identified

- Easily got aggressive and harm others by hitting, pushing, kicking, spitting, biting or throwing objects
- Loss of memory
- Ran away from home
- Easily distractible behaviour
- Hyperactive nature
- Eating non-edible items
- Hurt themselves or others

Issues to be addressed:

- Parents are expecting to get trained in the area of managing children with disability
- Most commonly the children's behaviour was, when they get annoyed they become very aggressive and showing violent nature. They harm others also. Most of the time parents would not able to manage this situation. The parents want to address this issue.
- There is a need to develop trainers
- The parents have been facing unpleasant and very painful experiences from the general public

Executive Summary:

NIDAS (NISH Online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminar) has completed the financial year 2018-19. The major activities carried out are:

- 9 monthly sessions were held on various disabilities.
- 7 handbooks on rights & concessions available for individuals with disabilities
- A book on "Various disabilities under RPwD Act, 2016"
- ISL videos of NIDAS Vocational Papers
- Expanding NIDAS to LSG Institutions

NIDAS commenced on 30th October 2015, at NISH completed three years of functioning in this financial year 2018-19. It is supported and funded by Directorate of Social Justice, Government of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram. The project's primary aim is to inculcate disability awareness among the parents and caretakers of individuals with special needs who are unaware about the repercussions of disability. Every third Saturdays, we conduct monthly online sessions on various disabilities and related issues enlisted under RPwD Act, 2016. These Malayalam sessions are telecasted live at DCPUs, where participants of each district can approach for participating. The major activities carried out under NIDAS head are as follows (Annexure I).

NIDAS sessions: In this financial year 2018-19, NIDAS team held 9 sessions on various topics (Annexure II). Due to flood in Kerala, we cancelled sessions of August & September 2018. Afterwards, on 2018 Nov 17th due to unexpected Hartal declared, the session was postponed to January 2019. NIDAS Team made a visit to Thiruvananthapuram DCPU Office at Poojappura, and gave Disability sensitization and technical training for NIDAS. NIDAS Social Worker, Ms. Nilasha made a visit to Idukki District Social Justice Office at Kattappana, to provide awareness on NIDAS.

Handbook: NIDAS Team prepared and published handbooks on rights, concessions available for individuals with 7 disabilities namely Autism Spectrum Disorder, Hearing Impairment, Vision Impairment, Cerebral palsy, Intellectual Disability, Learning Disability and Loco motor Disability (Annexure III).

Book Publishing: NIDAS Team is prepared to publish a book with title, "Disability: An overview in the context of RPWD Act, 2016". The specific objective of this book is to provide first-hand information to the beginners, researchers, scholars, students, and the legal professionals. This is an initiative to promote a barrier-free and fully accessible environment for all the people with disability (Annexure IV).

Accessibility: NIDAS Team has updated NIDAS website and have made it screen reader compatible. In order to make the website accessible to all, we have recorded videos of NIDAS Vocational papers in Indian Sign Language format, and will be uploaded soon (Annexure V).

LSGI Expansion: If the consent to expand NIDAS to Block Panchayat Offices is availed from LSG Department, Govt. of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram, NIDAS Team is ready to conduct the pilot stage of the same (Annexure VI).



1. Appointment of Two Social Workers



- 2. Ms. Nilasha S., MSW


They have joined NIDAS since 22nd of November 2019.

















48 NIDAS on Importance for early speech and language intervention in children with Cleft lip and / or palate

NISH has conducted a social awareness programme called Swastik which comprised of awareness classes, exhibitions and screening tests from 2nd December to 4th December 2019 at Mahatma Ayyankali Hall, Thiruvananthapuram as part of World Disability Day of 2019, NIDAS Team has taken this opportunity to sensitize people on basic etiquettes while interacting with Persons with disabilities through visual aids . and oriented participants about NIDAS and the ways for participation in it. In addition the stall has displayed RPwD act features, Niramaya Scheme, how to get disability Certificate and pamphlets on Schemes for differently abled under Social Justice Department. The book on Disability: an Overview by NISH and Handbooks on various disabilities were also exhibited in the stall. NIDAS has explained the visitors about these and distributed handbooks on demand and collected the details of persons who was interested to get the academic book. Moreover, NIDAS mobile app has been introduced to the people and installed in their mobile. The details of interested participants for next NIDAS session has been collected and enquired about the possibilities of having NIDAS session in organizations and special school who work for persons with disabilities

4. Equipment Reinstallation in DCPU, Kozhikode

District Child Protection Unit, Kozhikode had requested for the reinstallation of the equipment provided by NIDAS Team as their office maintenance work has been completed. NIDAS Technical expert has made a visit to DCPU Kozhikode and completed reinstallation work of NIDAS Equipment on 10th January 2020.

NIDAS Team had a session with Social Work Students from Loyola College, Thiruvananthapuram regarding disability sensitization and NIDAS. Ms. Shirly, Head, New Initiatives, NISH had delivered a session on Disability Sensitisation. In addition a brainstorming session had been conducted about how Social Work Students can contribute to reach parents and caretakers of Children with Disability. They suggested the importance of ensuring participation of ICDS Workers and Kudumbhasree Members.

7. Step to make academic book available through kindle

NIDAS team has approached three different agencies to collect quotation regarding conversion into e-book version namely Consors Technologies PVT LTD, Thiruvananthapuram, C-Dit and DC Books Kottayam for the purpose of making NISH's first academic Book "DISABILITY: AN OVERVIEW IN THE CONTEXT OF RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (RPwD) ACT, 2016" available at Amazon Kindle edition.

Consors Technology has an online portal called **Kerala Book Store.com.** which is a one-stop destination where one will get books written in Malayalam from various publishers. They have got more than 10,000 collections in their store, one can avail the books in any form, such as audiobook, paperback or eBook, Also, they will list the book in 'Kelkkam' mobile application (Kelkkam is a mobile application developed by the party for the sale and promotion of books). NISH and party had a meeting for discussion of terms and services. They informed the following

8. Initiatives evolved from NIDAS Sessions

Dwarfism EIP Camp



Based on the 43rd Session of NIDAS on Dwarfism by Dr. Tittu Oommen, it is said short stature can be somehow preventable and early detection is necessary. Furthermore a child's height can be predicted based on their father's and mother's height. NIDAS Team decided to monitor the growth rate of EIP students in NISH in order to predict their future height and see any immediate medical attention for the children who undergo the monitoring by recording the progress of their growth in the Growth Chart by CDC.

NIDAS Team has started monitoring the progress of 15 students in the early intervention Programme and couldn't proceed further as EIP has shut as the Government declared Holidays for schools inview of COVID19 outbreak in the state.

• NIDAS Follow up sessions:

CP child_physiotherapy and CATI

Through 44th NIDAS session, two persons with cerebral palsy could seek immediate therapy The steps taken by the team are as given below:

For 12 yr old girl, Physiotherapist and Occupational Therapist have made initial assessment of the child and found that she immediately requires therapies. They will proceed with the intervention techniques once they consult with the person's concerned with Assistive technology also. For 33 yr old person who is severely affected with Cerebral palsy requires a combined assessment of the Physiotherapy unit and Assistive technology unit. A combined assessment has been made by a team of Speech Language Pathologist, Physiotherapist, Occupational therapist and Technical Experts of Assistive Technology and found that the person's motor skills are severely affected due to the lack of proper use of the muscles. They have suggested several intervention strategies. NIDAS Team also facilitated the caretakers to access the best possible services of pain and palliative care from Pallium India.



• Individual sessions with parents of children with cleft lip and palate.

Through 47 NIDAS, parents of children with cleft lip and palate could have an opportunity to have an online assessment of their children possible with Dr. Mathew P.C, who was the speaker and Project Director of Craniofacial department, St. Thomas Hospital Chengannor and Ms Manju S, Assistant Professor Audiology and Speech Language department. It was inaccessible for the parents to have the assessment in the COVID-19 Pandemic situation. Necessary Instructions has been provided for the well being of these children.



Through 48 NIDAS, many children with Cleft lip and Palate from Northern Part of Kerala do not have online facilities for online therapy. The session helped them with possibilities of online therapy.

• Donation to financial support for a child to hearing aid As Dr Mathew PC, Project Director, Cleft and Craniofacial Surgery Department, St Thomas Hospital, Chengannaor, who was the speaker for 47 NIDAS conducted

on 14th August 2020 conveyed his interest to contribute his remuneration to aid poor patients.

NIDAS Team took an initiative to find a person in need and identified a child from idukki who is in need of assistance for buying hearing aid and the amount of 2,500 is transferred to their account.

9. Just Like Me- Disability sensitization to LP school kids

NIDAS Team has met Dr. J Prasad, Director, SCERT, regarding Including Disability Sensitization lessons in Lower Primary School Curriculum. It is informed that curriculum revision will happen only during the next state assembly. They have informed the possibility of including disability sensitisation as one of the components in Vacation Training for Teachers along with other social sensitisation projects. On the contrary, it also could not be processed with respect to COVID19 lockdown Measures.


10. Second Academic Book Publication

The 50th NIDAS Webinar

NIDAS is set foot on its 50th session coming on 21st November 2020 on the topic "Promoting Cognitive Health for Effective Communication in Aging Adults" as it can benefit a major population. The speaker for the session will be Dr. Vinitha Mary George, Assistant Professor & HOD, Dept. of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology, National Institute of Speech & Hearing (NISH), Trivandrum

NIDAS Team has decided to conduct the 50th session on cognitive health as it can benefit a major population. The total number of people with dementia worldwide in 2010 - 35.6 million and worldwide incidence is 7.7 million, implying one new case every four seconds. Much of the increase will be in countries, such as China, India, and their South Asian and Western Pacific neighbors, fastest growth in the elderly population taking place. the number expected to be 65.7 million by 2030. it is a serious problem to be looked into.

Cognition is one of the superior faculties of mental processes which interacts with language and plays a critical role in the process of communication in humans. Declines in cognitive abilities have been strongly associated with the progression of age. Middle age is an important transitional phase in adulthood during which concerns towards cognitive declines tend to emerge. With a rapid increase in the aging population, a considerable rise in the prevalence of cognitive-communicative disorders such as dementia is expected. This grave scenario demands an imperative need towards preventing the occurrence or delaying the onset of such disorders, by maintaining or improving the cognitive-communicative health through simple everyday related cognitive exercises among the individuals who are currently in their middle age or even younger. Therefore, this kind of session is a need of hour and equip many middle age group to take necessary actions to avoid the occurrence.

SMILE Together

It has been designed for improving the social communication skills among children, and positive communication with children with oro facial cleft. This also aims at alleviating the emotional issues faced by children with oro facial cleft, owing to their facial difference.

For the conduct of NISH online Interactive Disability Awareness Seminar (NIDAS), NISH has got administrative sanction from Directorate of Social Justice, GoK for the year 2020, October -2021 March with reference number 661/2020/SJD, dated 22/11/202. Amount of rupees 4,22,000/- sanctioned as operational cost. The major activities accomplished under NIDAS from October 2020 to March 2021 are included as follows.

1.NIDAS Monthly Sessions

The NIDAS Team has held 6 sessions on various topics. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19 and the Government regulations, the Webinars were conducted using different Online platforms such as Google Meet, Microsoft Team, Webex, Youtube live streaming etc. For the time being it is informed to the DCPUs not to invite participants to the centres.

The 49th NIDAS Session was on the topic Comprehensive Pre and Post surgical care in children with Cleft lip and/or palate, which was led by Dr Gayathri, MDS Fellow, Cleft and Craniofacial Surgery, St Thomas hospital Malakkara.

The abstract: Management of the children with a cleft is best carried out by a multidisciplinary team of healthcare professionals from birth through to adulthood. It has been recommended by the Steering Group on Cleft Lip and Palate that the care of children with clefts should be carried out by a team whose members are able to provide a comprehensive service including surgical, dental care, audiology, speech and language, counseling, and clinical genetics services. Children having Cleft Lip and Palate have specific needs with regard to their oral health which can be identified at different stages of dental development, from birth to the adult years. Based on the stages of dentition the orthodontic treatment can be divided into presurgical orthopedics, primary dentition, mixed dentition, and permanent dentition. Some of the commonly seen dental issues involve multiple teeth, missing teeth, microdontia, hypodontia, ectopic teeth, crown and root malformation, etc. In recent years, the oral health professional's role has evolved with the rise of early orthopedic treatment of the predentate infant. Thus the role of an oral health professional in a multidisciplinary cleft lip and palate team is pivotal as they address the preventive and restorative needs of the child.

The 50th NIDAS Session was on the topic Promoting Cognitive Health for Effective Communication in Aging Adults, which was led by Dr. Vinitha Mary George Assistant Professor & HOD Dept. of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology National Institute of Speech & Hearing (NISH) Trivandrum

Abstract: Cognition is one of the superior faculties of mental processes which interacts with language and plays a critical role in the process of communication in humans. Declines in cognitive abilities have been strongly associated with the progression of age. Middle age is an important transitional phase in adulthood during which concerns towards cognitive declines tend to emerge. With a rapid increase in the aging population, a considerable rise in the prevalence of cognitive-communicative disorders such as dementia is expected. This grave scenario demands an imperative need towards preventing the occurrence or delaying the onset of such disorders, by maintaining or improving the cognitive-communicative health through simple everyday related cognitive exercises among the individuals who are currently in their middle age or even younger.

The 51st NIDAS Session was on the topic Awareness on auditory listening difficulties in the classroom environment among children having hearing impairment led by Ms. Saumya Sundaram, Asst. Professor/Clinical Coordinator, National Institute of Speech & Hearing (NISH), Thiruvananthapuram.

Abstract: Advancement in technology and early intervention has resulted in an increase in the number of children having hearing impairment being fitted with various hearing devices and being mainstreamed. In the mainstreamed classroom listening and understanding are an integral part for effective teaching and learning, poor classroom acoustics due to the increased noise, reverberation, signal to noise ratio and other factors results in increasing the cognitive load, reducing attention, concentration, memory and academic performance. Thus, there is a need to understand the challenges faced by the children in the classroom environment and adopt appropriate strategies for facilitating affecting the teaching learning environment.

The 52nd NIDAS Session was conducted on the topic Social welfare scheme and services for persons with Disabilities, which was led by Dr. Roshan Bijlee K.N., Director, Composite Regional Centre for Persons with Disabilities-Kerala (CRC-K), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

Abstract: The need for social security has now become the emergency requirement of the well-being of the persons with disability. The state and central government have undertaken more focused and comprehensive efforts for the welfare and inclusion of the particular population in the forms of various social welfare schemes and services. This session is going to discuss the existing schemes and services for Persons with Disability.

The 53rd Session was conducted on the topic Mental Health and Well-being of children with disabilities, their parents and caretakers by Ms. Aroline K Tom, Founder & Director, BrightRay-Training, Research and Consulting. Thiruvananthapuram. The webinar was conducted on the same day as "World Social Justice day".


Abstract: Parenting a child with a disability is always a very challenging process. Lack of awareness among the parents to deal with such a child worsen the scenario. This has a tremendous impact on the mental health of the whole family. Thus, it is very necessary to empower them and ensure their participation in the growth and development of the society. This presentation includes the importance of mental health, factors affecting mental health and ways to improve mental health and well-being in the context of having a child with disability.

The one hour session followed by an interactive session and the parents and caretakers shared their valuable comments on the topic. During this COVID-19 pandemic period, most of the schools are shut down, there is a transition from direct services to tele-services in almost all the therapy centres, all these changes have great impact on the life of persons with disabilities as well as their parents and caretakers.

In such a scenario NIDAS Team has found the need to initiate some activities to improve their mental health and well-being. For that the 53rd webinar was conducted on the topic of Mental health and well-being. The was completely a successful session as the participants themselves shared their thoughts on the same.

The 54th session was conducted on the topic Stuttering: What to do, what not to do? By Nirmal Sugathan, Speech-Language Pathologist, Dept. of Audiology & Speech-Language Pathology, National Institute of Speech & Hearing (NISH), Thiruvananthapuram

Abstract: Stuttering is one of the most common types of speech disorders affecting children and adults. This disorder, which begins between the ages of 2 and 5, can be almost completely cured if treated within the first few years. But limited knowledge about this and parents' tendency to self-medicate make the child a lifelong victim. This awareness program includes guidelines for persons affected with stuttering and parents of children with stuttering to create more awareness about disability.



Research study: Awareness and Institutional Readiness for Inclusion of Individuals with Deaf & Hard of Hearing in the Higher Educational Setting

51st NIDAS webinar on the topic of "Awareness of auditory listening skills difficulties in the classroom environment for the children with Hearing Impairment" on 19th December 2020. The session was led by Ms. Saumya Sundaram, Assistant Professor/clinical coordinator, NISH, Thiruvananthapuram. the session was followed by an live interaction with participants, doubts were raised by the educators and parents on the how children with hearing impairment could be mainstreamed into the regular classroom, what all steps needs to be taken to facilitate teaching learning in a regular classroom environment, need for the involvement of the school authorities and policy makers towards the execution of the measure necessary for the inclusion of children into the mainstream environments, challenges faced by The children with HI being mainstreamed. After the interactive session the NIDAS team had a brainstorming session and the need to understand the current situation of the educational institutions for adopting inclusive strategy with special reference to admitting students with hearing impairment and make the school management aware about the important of establishing an favourable campus/classroom environment for effective teaching learning process was identified. From that discussion it was found by the team that there is a need to understand the current situation of the educational institutions for adopting inclusive strategy with special reference to admitting students with hearing impairment and make the management aware about the importance of establishing a favourable campus/classroom environment for an effective teaching learning process.

Abstract

Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016 sought to enforce the paradigm of inclusive education and reiterates that all educational institutions funded or recognized by them provide inclusive education to the children with disabilities. According to Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, "Government and the local authorities shall ensure that every child with disability as mentioned in RPwD Act gets benefits of Right to Education Act specifically in respect of Section 2(d) and 2(ee)". Though we have such constitutional safeguards, in the mainstreamed classroom, poor classroom acoustics due to the increased noise, reverberation, signal to noise ratio and other factors results in increasing the cognitive load, reducing attention, concentration, memory and academic performance of individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing. Thus there is a need to understand the challenges faced by the children in the classroom environment and adopting appropriate strategies for facilitating an effective teaching learning environment. This descriptive study aims to understand Awareness and Institutional Readiness for Inclusion of Individuals with Deaf & Hard of Hearing in a Higher Educational Setting.

The review of existing literature led us to identify two key domains of investigation-AWARENESS and INSTITUTIONAL READINESS.

The aim of the study: To study the level of Awareness on hearing loss and Institutional Readiness for Inclusion of Individuals with Hearing Loss in Higher Educational Settings in the State of kerala.

Objectives:

- To study the awareness level on hearing loss, its management and classroom acoustics among the institutional heads in higher educational settings.
- To study the institutional readiness for the Inclusion of students with HI in higher educational settings.

The data will be collected from the Government arts & science and engineering colleges from the State of Kerala electronically through google forms. The analysis will be done using appropriate statistical methods.

Due to time constraints, could complete data collection from two colleges only. Will continue this study during the next project period.





Innovations by Youth with Disability (I-YwD): Program Summary





A project by Kerala Development Innovations Strategic Council Implemented by National Institute of Speech and Hearing

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Kerala Development and Innovation Strategic Council (K-DISC) launched a project called Young Innovators' Program (YIP) to prepare selected youth in Kerala to be innovators and leaders in society as part of its strategic initiatives for development in the state. Additional deliberations brought out the need for enhancing inclusiveness through provision of similar opportunities for youth with disabilities (YwD). Subsequently, the Innovations by Youth with Disability (I-YwD) project was initiated following detailed consultations with disability experts from across the world and the implementation of the program was assigned to a newly formed team at the National Institute of Speech and Hearing.

I-YwD is currently in its 1st cycle, a pilot phase of implementation, which is being thoroughly reviewed and documented so as to ensure its maturation into a sound and replicable model. The program is being run in different phases and the document lists out the objectives, preparatory stages and the implementation details of each of the phases.

The key learnings from the run of the program so far play a significant role in the restructuring of the program for the future cycles. Some of the compelling lessons learnt include the call for high levels of customisation in curriculum content and delivery modes due to the diversity of participants, the benefits of having present facilitators from within the participants' communities, the need for experiential learning opportunities to go hand-in-hand with the theoretical components and the opportunities for reciprocal growth in participants when interactions and engagements are planned in mixed disability groups. Based on these documented observations a modified framework for the second cycle of I-YwD is proposed, further explained in three phases – intake phase, group learning phase and mentoring phase. The document concludes with a review of the scope of this inclusive innovative entrepreneurship program, Innovations by Youth with Disability.

1. Overview

In 2018, the idea of Youth Innovators Program (YIP) was mooted by the "Kerala Development and Innovation Strategic Council" (K-DISC). The program targets children and youth, to empower them as future innovators. The aim is to prepare the youth to identify problems in society and find innovative solutions that will have maximum impact. The expected outcome from the target group of youth is initiation of products, services or models to meet emerging needs in a fast-changing society. As change-makers, they are expected to effectively identify unarticulated needs of the society and generate solutions that will make the world a better place for present and future generations.

It is to the credit of the leadership of K-DISC, that decision was made to include youth with disabilities (YwD) in this program. In order to overcome barriers for YwD, accommodations and adaptations needed to be provided and hence a separate program named Innovations by Youth with Disability (I-YwD) was organized in parallel.

A round of internet based asynchronous discussions among a group of about 60 experts who work in the field of disabilities was conducted in August 2018. This was to explore the feasibility of implementing an innovation program, for people with different disabilities such as visual, hearing, mobility and intellectual challenges. Several ideas emerged and a 2 day face to face workshop was organized on December 5th and 6th in Trivandrum to prepare a preliminary report on selection of participants, the team, curriculum and implementation aspects of this special project. K-DISC assigned the implementation of the project to National Institute of Speech and Hearing, (NISH), Trivandrum. A team was assigned the task of taking this forward.

Research and interactions with disability experts from across the world led to the conclusion that an inclusive model for such an undertaking is currently non-existent. For this reason, cycle one (2019) of I-YwD is a pioneering effort, as a result of which it is to be regarded a pilot implementation of the program. Each step of the project, its review and recommendations are documented. It is imperative to note that there is constant fine-tuning of structure as the program progresses. By doing so, the goal is to formulate a well-documented, systematised programme that maybe put into practice by any team with competence, anywhere. It is expected that continual iterations be made to the program during the implementation of the initial few cycles of I-YwD in order to produce an inclusive innovation program that is coherent and thorough. Through iterations based on learnings, it is the mandate of I-YwD to evolve a sound, systematic and replicable model.

2. I-YwD 2019: The Pilot

The I-YwD project identifies and empowers persons with disabilities who are self-motivated to formulate and implement innovations in society. Innovation for the framework of this project is defined as a unique and well-formed idea or solution to a pertinent problem in society. The innovator will question the status quo and think creatively to bring an outcome that will have a positive change benefiting all stakeholders. It can be for-profit or non-profit.

People with disabilities are often excluded and their creative potential unaddressed. Conceptualising inclusion as a value that celebrates diversity, reciprocal growth and aims for accessible universal design, I-YwD's goal is to nurture innovators from this marginalised community. The combination of innovation and inclusion creates a fertile field for solutions from social change makers that make the society a better place to live in.

For the participant innovators (PI) to achieve their goal, the I-YwD project provides resources in the forms of training and mentoring for a period of two years or till their ideas have materialized and stabilized, whichever happens earlier. The idea could take the shape of, a product, a service, applied research or a combination. In order for the idea to actualise, the program offers knowledge, tools, perspective and motivation to the participants.

2.1 I-YwD 2019 Cycle: Summary

Preface

The unique opportunity and challenge has been that an inclusive program for innovative entrepreneurship with pedagogy, curriculum, infrastructure and facilitation that addresses the integration of a diverse group with diverse needs is currently non-existent. The preparation part of the program started from ground zero. It has been the purpose of I-YwD to address issues starting from developing an accessible conceptualisation of abstract concepts in innovation to making a logistical frame for mentorship that is accessible for all.

The program which was initiated in January of 2019 has seen the completion of three phases (1A, 1B, 1C) and is currently gearing up for the launch of the fourth. Each phase has had its own objectives, preparatory steps and learnings.

Phase 1A (February to March, 2019)

Objectives

For the participants to self-reflect, explore and better understand themselves and each other were the key objectives of Phase 1A. Disability sensitisation and pedagogic optimisation were added objectives for the team. Such an understanding has proven to be indispensable in the development of a meaningful and all-inclusive curriculum for the phases that followed.

Preparation

- In order to meet the objectives, a range of professionals that include occupational therapists, psychologists, sign language interpreters, technicians, disability experts, domain knowledge experts, and facilitators were mobilised.
- Curriculum workshop, curriculum adaptation and disability sensitisation were conducted
- A mock camp was organised

Run of the phase

Being the first exploratory run of the program, emphasis was given to having a heterogeneous participant group representing the diversity of youth with disabilities in Kerala. Of the 23 who expressed interest, 19 accepted the invitation to attend the camp. This included Deaf and hard of hearing (9), Visually impaired (3), Cerebral Palsy and Orthopaedic disability (5), and Autism Spectrum (2). The 6 day-long 'Initiation camp' (from March 26th to 31st, 2019) was a culmination of efforts to customise and optimise the run of the program for the 2019 cohort. Themes of engagement during the camp were strength and passion identification, interdependence, and communication. Short multimedia presentations were submitted by each participant at the end of the camp.

A preliminary evaluation of the participants' potential and a blueprint for the universal design for the program forward based on a detailed review was then collated.

Phase 1B

Objectives/Challenges

The goal of the phase was to offer participants the tools and skills required to identify and define a problem statement and arrive at plausible innovative solutions.

(April to September, 2019)

Preparation

- A curriculum workshop
- Sensitisation on disability themes for the new set of trainers
- Curriculum adaptation for different disabilities
- Consultation with autism spectrum specialists to address the needs of participants in the spectrum
- Mock camp
- Pre camp for participants in the autism spectrum
- Pre camp for Deaf participants

Run of the phase

The process began by assigning participants to internal mentors and introducing them to an online Learning Management System called Moodle that guided their learning up to the next camp. The second camp, 'Idea Springboard' (from September 16th to 21st, 2019) was organised as a culmination of this phase. The emphasis was on models and processes to create and develop ideas through Design Thinking and Concept Transformation. The process of innovation was introduced to the participants over the first four days through hands-on experiential engagements using a generic theme common to all participants. This first stage addressed exploration, discovery, solutioning and storytelling, where participants worked in groups. This was followed by a two-day application stage, where the methods introduced over the first four days were applied by individual participants in their own newly identified projects. The output of Idea Springboard was the participants' ideas presented on a Lean Canvas. 8 out of the 19 participants successfully completed this phase of the program. Personal and professional pressures and inability to attend the camp (a requisite for continued participation in the program) were the reasons for the dropout.

Phase 1C (October to December, 2019)

Objectives/Challenges

The goal is to equip the participants with requisite skills for launching the pilot of their projects.

Preparation

- Identification of mentors from different domains
- A curriculum workshop
- Sensitisation on disability themes for the new set of trainers

- Curriculum adaptation for different disabilities
- Mock camp
- Pre camp for Deaf participants

Run of the Phase

Currently the participants are in a phase where they are engaged in refining their Lean Canvases to solidify their ideas. They will be connected to external mentors with domain expertise, who will guide them in the different areas pertaining to their project initiation. Some of the domain areas where the mentors will be having expertise in are fundraising, marketing, legalities, intellectual property rights etc. A customised plan for progress is charted out by the participant and his/her mentor. The sessions for common themes that need to be addressed for the cohort will be facilitated by catalysts in the camp that culminates the third phase, planned to be held from December 14th to December 16th.

Phase 2 (January, 2020 to January 2021) It is expected that following the end of the first phase, a **pilot of the project** will be launched by the participant, under the guidance of the mentors. During the period of phase 2, there will be intermittent camps for participants to review each other's progress and fill gaps in knowledge and conceptual understandings.

(See **Annexure 1** for a timeline of the first cycle of I-YwD).

2.2 Key Learnings

1. The participants form a diverse group with regards to learning and language modalities, experience and exposure. This calls for a highly customised curriculum and content delivery at varied and individualised paces.

It has been a challenge to facilitate sessions that are optimally paced for each participant's comprehension and engagement. In Phase 1 B, while the participants who use a visual mode of communication found the sessions optimally paced, the participants who use auditory language found the pace too slow. Participants were at different levels with regards to their domain expertise and project ideation, necessitating a highly customised management of learning paths and schedules. This same variation in expertise made it difficult for participants to follow group sessions at the same pace and efficiency as the

others. It was found that there were many gaps in conceptual understanding and vocabulary that needed to be bridged for certain participants to be able to access the content in the main sessions along with the other participants. Though an easy solution could have been the separation of participants based on their need for bridge-components, such a division would end up in them being segregated based on their disabilities and limit the opportunities for them to be exposed to different perspectives, all of which defeat the philosophy of the program itself.

2. Theoretical sessions supported by practice-based modules was found to be most conducive for the innovation process.

Innovation and entrepreneurship are very hands-on themes of engagements. Participants should be facilitated to be able to directly apply the theoretical knowledge they gained to the real world context. Moreover, this experiential learning process will enhance the potential of the participant to self-learn and pace the learning to suit their individual levels of competence. Through this, disability barriers are transcended.

3. As important as the quality of the curriculum content is the availability of the facilitators with first-hand experience and sensitivity.

It has been found that the presence of a facilitator from within the specific community has tremendous benefits for the learning of participants from that community. This is due to the familiarity and relatability that they have with the community's culture, language and disposition.

4. Awareness of and interaction with one's own and other disabilities created a deep impact on participants and widened their perspectives.

Both phases of the program saw participants interacting with each other across disabilities and contributing to each other's growth.

5. Awareness/PR activity needs to be significantly higher

Youth with disabilities are excluded from mainstream communication channels. More elaborate efforts have to be made to reach out to them as well as to ease the entry into the program for the next cycle.

To address the above mentioned list of challenges/learnings, modifications are proposed in the **pace**, **duration** and **structure** of the program as elaborated in the next section.

3. Cycle Two: 2020

Based on the learnings from the first cycle of Innovations by Youth with Disability, the team proposes a restructured program for the next iteration of I-YwD. With the modified framework, the program hopes to integrate the learnings from the previous cycle and to better facilitate innovation, inclusion and experiential learning.

Innovation requires that scaffolds be taken off and unique paths be explored. Correspondingly, inclusion requires diversity to be celebrated and person specific paths to be set to facilitate integration. So I-YwD proposes a program structure that meets the participants where they are at, empowers them and facilitates them to become leaders and progress further independently.

The upcoming 2020 program is divided into three phases, each of which is a restructured version of the previous cycle.

3.1 Intake phase

There is no one definition for innovation or innovator. Similarly, there is no one criteria that could fairly judge people with different abilities and learning styles. Considering these challenges, I-YwD recommends a selection process that 'differentially appreciates' individuals with varied strengths, potential and expression styles. Adopting a flexible model, I-YwD has identified 8 criteria out of which an applicant meeting any 5 qualifies for the program. Spread across three months the selection process has telephonic screening, interview in the presence of a disability expert, a camp and a month long virtual review phase. Such an approach is adopted in order to ensure that no individual with the potential and passion to become an innovator is excluded because of a strait jacketed understanding of innovation. I-YwD is prepared to take in 50 participants for the camp and select 25 for the entry into the program. Since the camp would have components that address personal development, alongside being an intake point it will also be a preparatory one to the rest of the program. The content will be similar to that of Phase 1A of the 2019 cycle.

3.2 Group Learning Phase

This part of the program has two streams geared towards addressing the differential pace and availability of the participants.

Stream 1 is a track that comprises of 10 weekend camps spread across 1 year. For each of the 5 key camps, there would be an orientation camp with more stress on experiential learning and hands-on practical engagements. The pre-camps would address the need to bridge knowledge and vocabulary gap.

Stream 2 is a track that comprises of 5 weekend camp. Those participants belonging to stream 1 who wish to attend all or part of the pre-camps offered to stream 1 may choose to do so. Both streams 1 and 2 will come together for all 5 camps.

3.3 Mentoring Phase

In the 2019 cycle, mentoring has been dispersed across Phases 1B, 1C and 2. In the upcoming cycle these engagements will be condensed to form a continuous phase of mentoring. This period is expected to coincide with the launch of the pilot of the projects by the participants. Regular guidance from the mentors is expected to fine-tune the pilot's launch and run. From the 2019 cycle's implementation, it has been deduced that both subject specific and stage specific mentors are essential. Subject specific mentors mentor on domain knowledge such as hospitality, nutrition, software development etc. and see through the evolution of the whole project. Stage specific mentors come in when required to guide the participant on stage specific skills like fund raising, branding, marketing etc.

4. Scope

4.1 Contribution to Society

As a result of marginalisation, people with disabilities have been restricted in their opportunities to engage in entrepreneurship. Actualising the creativity in them have dual benefits for society:

- 1. The problems in the disability community are best understood by the community members themselves. There are gaps in technology, infrastructure, pedagogical processes etc. to fully and meaningfully include persons with disability into the society. Many of the innovations by PwDs are for PwDs; effectively solving the problems faced by their communities, thereby bringing the society closer to becoming accessible and inclusive for all.
- 2. The innovations by individuals with disabilities are not just for their communities. Endowed with different learning, processing and expression styles, the members of the PwD community often have fresh perspective on problems faced by the general public. Owing to the marginalisation they have experienced, they have the potential to be innovators who think along a strong rights based approach. I-YwD actualises this potential.

4.2 Disability Sensitisation

During the run of the first cycle itself, a range of professionals across different domains were sensitised to the needs and preferences of individuals with disability. This is a crucial step in creating a ripple effect that transforms the service sector in the state to being a more responsive, accessible and inclusive one.

4.3 Pool of Resources

Already in the run of the program, mentors, institutions and other expertise groups, who are valuable for interdisciplinary engagement in entrepreneurship, have been identified and set. This is a valuable resource pool, not only for the future iterations of this program but also for any other program with similar objectives.

4.4 A Replicable, Relatable Model


I-YwD began from ground zero where there were no relatable models to learn from or replicate. In the process of developing the program, the team has assimilated session plans, protocols for interpretation, technical enhancements, infrastructure accessibility auditing guidelines etc. The very structure of the camp that prioritises inclusion is a model

for any other inclusive program. For instance, the breakup of the camp into pre-camp, camp and post-camp along with the corresponding curriculum breakup and logistical plans is a breakthrough in inclusive pedagogy.

4.5 Building Solidarity as a Community

The R-PwD act recognises 21 different kinds of disabilities. Though the law recognises the diversity of the community, there is hardly any opportunity in the social spheres for people with different kinds of disabilities to come together, network and engage in partnership. The space offered by the I-YwD program creates possibilities for a solidaric PwD community to emerge in the state, thereby fuelling reciprocal growth within the community and stronger advocacy efforts by the community.



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Tie-up with Hospitals-Neonatal screening

Neonatal hearing screening at Credence Hospital, Trivandrum was a major outreach program of Dept of ASLP, NISH. The program was initiated in November 2018. Audiologists were deputed twice a week for conducting the neonatal hearing screening. OtoAcoustic Emissions (OAE) were the major tool for the screening program. A relatively quiet room in the hospital was carefully chosen for the testing after the team from NISH visited the hospital premises as OAE is a noise-sensitive test.

The OAE equipment along with accessories was provided by the hospital. Newborns were scheduled in collaboration with the staff of the neonatal ward so that every newborn got an appointment slot before they get discharged from the hospital and to ensure that none of them missed the screening procedure. The results were counselled and issued to the caregiver/staff nurse after the testing. For all clients who needed rescreening/ missed appointments, an appointment was scheduled during the vaccination day (45 days) by the staff nurse. This was done to ensure that we did not lose any clients to follow up. All clients who referred screening twice/ are suspicious of hearing loss due to High-Risk Register (HRR) were referred for a direct appointment at NISH for detailed audiological evaluation.

Memorandum of Understanding between NISH, Akkulam and Credence

Hospital, Ulloor, Trivandrum for an Outreach Program at Credence Hospital

Neonatal Hearing screening.

This Memorandum of Understanding was made and entered upon between National Institute of Speech and Hearing, Trivandrum, hereinafter known as (NISH) and Credence Hospital, Trivandrum, hereinafter known as the hospital, on the 1st of November 2017, for conducting hearing screening of new born babies using OAE screeners at the Hospital by NISH. This being conducted as a part of the outreach programs of NISH, no payment shall be charged from the part of NISH to provide this service at the Hospital.

The following shall be the terms and conditions of this service. The terms and conditions shall be reviewed every six months to include even any minor changes that may be effected and annually for any major changes. Authorised representatives of both the organizations shall sign this document as a token of acceptance and adherence to these terms and conditions.

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Technical Framework of the Neonatal Hearing

INTRODUCTION

Hearing loss is one of the common congenital deformity affecting 5.6 per 1000 live births in India. Congenital hearing loss can be caused due to a no: of reasons ranging from genetic cause to teratogen exposure during gestation period. Hearing loss may vary from slight to profound degree and may be unilateral or bilateral. However the consequence of congenital hearing loss cannot be limited to loss of audibility alone, but to other serious and life-long consequences affecting speech , language, social , academic as well as cognitive skills. Hence hearing loss should be identified and intervention should be provided to habilitate the child as early as possible to prevent the secondary effects of hearing loss. With this vision, hearing screening has been made mandatory by Universal Neonatal Hearing Screening (UNHS) program for all neonates. Joint Committee for Infant Hearing (JCIH) 2007 recommends hearing screening to be administered at no later than 1 month, diagnostic evaluation within 3 months and rehabilitation to begin no later than 6 months. Thanks to the modern technology, at the present times hearing loss can be detected just hours after birth using hand-held portable screening devices, and rehabilitation technology ranging from hearing aids to cochlear implants are no longer beyond the reach of common man.

Aim

To screen all new born babies for hearing loss

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Method

Target population


- All new born babies from November 2017
- Babies on follow-up who missed hearing screening during their hospital stay.

Tools

- Oto Acoustic Emission screener- A sensitive hearing screening test capable of evaluating upto outer hair cells.
- Auditory Brainstem Response Screener- A sensitive hearing screening test capable of evaluating upto lower brainstem.

Protocol for babies falling under HRR criteria (see Appendix1)

To screen children falling in HRR criteria, AABR will be used as, such babies are at risk to develop a neural hearing loss such as Auditory Neuropathy as suggested by JCIH 2007. Screening should be carried out during the hospital stay within the discharge of the baby and rescreening if recommended should be carried out within the 1st month. If the baby refers in the rescreening, he/she would be referred for an immediate diagnostic evaluation. If the baby passes the AABR screening, then no further testing is indicated unless the child gets readmitted with a potential cause for hearing loss as listed in Appendix 2. However every child who passes the AABR screening would be given a parental education pamphlet regarding normal speech, language and auditory milestones to identify red flags for hearing loss or speech and language delay



Screening protocol for well-baby


To screen well-baby, OAE will be used. Screening should be carried out during the hospital stay within the discharge of the baby and rescreening if recommended should

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be carried out within the 1st month. For re-screening, AABR will be utilized. If the baby refers in the rescreening, he/she would be referred for an immediate diagnostic evaluation. If the baby passes the AABR screening, then no further testing is indicated unless the child gets readmitted with a potential cause for hearing loss as listed in Appendix 2. However every child who passes the AABR screening would be given a parental education pamphlet regarding normal speech, language and auditory milestones to identify red flags for hearing loss or speech and language delay.



Results and recommendations will be communicated with the parents/ caregivers and screening report be issued on the same visit.

Terms and Conditions are as follows:-

- The frequency of the service shall be thrice a week for one and a half hours. The frequency shall be reviewed after 6 months on the basis of caseload and shall be adjusted on mutual consent of the parties to MOU.
- One or more than one person shall be deputed by the HOD, Dept. of ASLP, NISH for this service at the Hospital.
- The staff deputed shall reach the Hospital by 8:30AM and shall be available till 10:15AM to conduct the screening procedures.
- Transportation from and to NISH shall be arranged by the Hospital free of cost.
- The Hospital shall provide OAE screeners, necessary accessories and consumables to perform the hearing screening.

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- AABR Screener shall be provided by NISH based on requirement to screen babies with High Risk Registers. The consumables required for AABR screener shall be provided by the Hospital.
- An air-conditioned quiet room shall be made available at the Hospital for the purpose.
- Neonates who fail twice on OAE screening and AABR shall be referred to NISH
 for detailed audiological assessments and the terms of service for such testing
 shall be as per the guidelines followed at NISH.
- Selected nursing practitioners in Neonatology Unit of the Hospital shall be trained to carry out the screening procedures.
- Any research initiative from either parties using the data originated during the terms of reference shall be on mutual consent.
- If the service is not found to be viable by either NISH or the Hospital, the service may be discontinued by giving 30 days' notice without causing any inconvenience to the current list of patients booked for screening.
- There shall not be any financial implications between NISH and the Hospital for this outreach program.
- The HOD of ASLP at NISH and the Neonatologist at the Hospital shall form the group to be responsible to oversee and monitor this service.

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
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Additional Skill Acquisition Program (ASAP) Training of the Trainers









Additional Skill Acquisition Program (ASAP), is an undertaking by the Higher Education Department of the Kerala Government that focuses on training students to improve their employability. Three sessions of ASAP Training of the Trainers was conducted at NISH to train the trainers.

Objectives of the programme:

- To impart different teaching strategies to improve learning outcomes of deaf and hard of hearing students
- To introduce and familiarise Indian Sign Language [ISL] to the SDEs
- To make the trainees understand the practices being followed at NISH to teach the students who are deaf and hard of hearing.
- To equip the SDEs to offer foundation modules in institutions of requirement in all three zones

The training of the third batch of trainers from ASAP took place from November 4 to 15 2019 for 2 weeks at NISH, Thiruvananthapuram.

Since its inception in 1997, NISH has made significant contributions for improving the quality of life of individuals with communication disorders and has taken pioneering effort in implementing various programs for the disabled population.

AND WHEREAS, discussion was initiated between Additional Skill Acquisition programme and **NISH** desirous of providing Skill Course Training in various sectors for the students with communication disorders enrolled or identified by NISH in batches of minimum size of 10 each.

AND WHEREAS, NISH has expressed its willingness to partner with ASAP to offer skill programmes to students enrolled with NISH and has submitted a proposal to offer.

AND WHEREAS, ASAP and NISH are desirous of entering into an agreement to improve employability of students in various job roles, facilitating ASAP to offer skill oriented courses in technical/academic collaboration with NISH

AND WHEREAS, the Parties appreciate each other's objectives in promoting excellence, *inter alia*, in education in common areas of interest and are desirous of entering into an Agreement for the aforesaid purpose. - 1.1.6 without prejudice to the above, any information exchanged between the Parties during the subsistence of this Agreement for the purposes of this Agreement.
- "PROGRAMMES" means the courses in particular sector (or such other programmes as may be jointly offered in future) that ASAP will offer to students with the support of NISH. Nationa

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1.4 "PROGRAMME MATERIAL" means the educational material developed by approved training service providers of ASAP provided in Printed hard copies/ Digital / Electronic mode to the enrolled students and ASAP. The educational material would be used for teaching the subjects covered under the courses (or such other programmes as may be jointly offered in future).

- 1.5 "STUDENT" means the individual with communication disorders enrolled or identified with NISH as a student for the courses (or such other programmes as may be jointly offered in future).
- 1.6 "FACULTY" means a trainer who knows ISL deployed by NISH or the Skill trainer assigned by the Training Service Provider empanelled by ASAP who in collaborative training mode will teach theory or practical at NISH in face to face teaching, online teaching, mentoring etc. for facilitating the learning process of the student of the Programmes.

2. OBJECTIVE

The parties have agreed to work together to offer suitable Skill Training programmes to the students enrolled.

3. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

- 3.1 Rights & Obligations of Government of Kerala
 - 3.1.1 Government of Kerala shall provide all the relevant information, guidelines and data to NISH to give effect to the scope and purpose of this agreement within agreed timelines of launching the Programmes.
- 3.1.2 Government of Kerala shall ensure that the Programmes offered under this agreement are in compliance with the relevant laws, rules, policies and procedures of Government of Kerala as well as other relevant Central/State Government or Statutory Authorities.

- 3.1.6 Government of Kerala shall entrust Training Service providers for the training for programmes, who in turn will engage suitable trainers attended the special Training of Trainers (ToT) for the transaction of the skill training in premises, laboratories or class rooms provided by NISH.
- 3.1.7 Government of Kerala through the Training Service Providers shall facilitate internship for students enrolled for Programmes in the aligned job role.
- 3.1.8 Government of Kerala shall organise assessment in association with Sector Skills Council/ approved third party assessment agency and shall issue joint certificates by Government of Kerala and The Training Service Provider to the students
 - 3.1.8 Government of Kerala will offer Programmes in NISH as per the standard requirements of the courses. The course fee shall be abiding to norms of GO (Rt) No 157/2014/H Ed, dated 01.04.2014 on Payment and receipt of fee for ASAP students.
- 3.1.10 ASAP shall facilitate and meet the expenses conducting training of trainers for both the trainers represented by NISH and Training Service providers in a mutually agreed location before the commencement of programme.

3.2 Rights & Obligations of NISH

3.2.1 NISH shall mobilise and identify the students in consultation with ASAP or the Training Service Provider assigned by ASAP based on the suitability of the

Management Information System (MIS) who will authorise the process of administrative approval at different stages like institution data entry, student data

entry, etc and shall monitor the effective conduct of the programme.

3.2.3 NISH shall identify and assign a responsible person as the Faculty Coordinator

who will coordinate the implementation of the programme and shall enter data

related to the institution, students, internal assessments etc time to time and report

the progress of the same as and when required by ASAP.

3.2.4 NISH shall provide the basic infrastructure such as class room, projector,

computers with internet connectivity, stationary, toilet facility, drinking water etc

required for the Centres where the courses are decided to commence for the

respective Programmes.

3.2.5 NISH shall arrange space and basic infrastructure including computers for

programme specific lab required for training in the identified locations mutually

agreed by the parties.

3.2.6 NISH shall identify the test centres for the final Examinations in consultation

with Government of Kerala the date, time of the examinations and inform the

students about the same. The schedule is not normally alterable as per any individual

candidate's request

3.2.7 NISH shall submit documentation report at the end of the programme

3.2.8 NISH shall deploy trainers having proficiency in ISL and willing to work in

tandem with the skill Trainers for the effective transaction of the programme

leading to employable skills in the students.

3.2.9 NISH shall ensure trainers under their pay role are reaching training centre at

least 30 minutes before the commencement of class and taking session as per

3.2.10 NISH shall ensure that the time lines will be adhered to.

3.3 Joint Rights and Obligations of Government of Kerala & NISH

- 3.3.1 Parties shall orient, screen and admit the students; confirm admissions and registrations of the students to the programme (s) and issue enrolment numbers and ID cards to registered students. Further, the list of the students enrolled for the programmes shall be provided by NISH to Government of Kerala within 10 working days of the closure of admission.
 - 3.3.2 Parties shall train the Trainers and deploy them at locations identified combinely for imparting Programme. Training of trainers with the help of master trainers and qualified trainers so that the NISH trainers can be equipped for collaborative transaction.
 - 3.3.3 The two trainers (TSP trainer and the NISH trainer) combinely conduct sessions for the students.
- 3.3.4 Undertake, either jointly or by itself such activities which are incidental to the successful implementation of the Programmes.
- 3.3.5 Both the Parties shall provide appropriate staff for providing deployment and administration of the Programmes.
- 3.3.6 Both the Parties reserve the right to audit the performance of the Programme through methods including without limitation, conduct inspection, surprise visit, in programme centres to ensure teaching standards and quality are maintained as per laid down norms and procedures from time to time.
- 3.3.7 Government of Kerala and NISH shall jointly finalise the manner and method and time for conduct of examinations pursuant to the Programme, time to time.
- 3.3.8 Both the parties shall identify and resort to different strategies ensuring maximum publicity and public awareness among the stakeholders, effective for of supholding the social relevance of the programme.

- 4.2 It is clarified herein that both Parties shall exclusively own and continue to retain all right, title and interest to its trade name/s, trade mark/s and logo/s and nothing contained herein is intended to assign or transfer any of the said rights in the trade names/trademarks and logo/s to the other Party.
- 4.3 Neither party during the course of performance of this agreement desire nor intend to transfer any intellectual property rights whatsoever with respect to any information that is proprietary.
- 4.4 The Parties acknowledge that they will not acquire any right, title, or interest in either party's trademarks, trade names, service marks, copyrights, patents, ideas, concepts, designs, specifications, models, processes, software systems, technologies, and other intellectual property owned or developed by either party.
- 4.5 NISH shall, at its own discretion, apply for and register in its own name, any trademark, copyright or other applicable intellectual property rights on the Programme and/or Programme Material and Government of Kerala hereby waives any and all objections or claims against such registration and shall cooperate and assist NISH whenever required, in completing such registration.

5. VALIDITY AND RENEWAL

This Agreement shall come into effect from the date of signing of this

6 TERMINATION

- 6.1 The Agreement shall be terminated immediately by mutual consent of the Parties; or by a written notice by the non-defaulting Party in the event the other Party commits a material breach of the Agreement and is unable to rectify it within 30 (Thirty) days after receiving a written notice of such material breach.
- 6.2 The Agreement shall be terminated by the Government of Kerala without assigning any reason whatsoever at any time.
- 6.3 In the larger interest of the students' future at stake, any termination of this Agreement, will not relieve the parties of their obligations specified in this Agreement for a period of three years after such termination or till the enrolled students complete their respective course; provided the students clear their examinations, clear all financial transactions and continue to fulfil the norms of the Parties
- 6.4 NISH shall not suo motto withdraw from the training programme once the course is commenced and shall continue as an operating partner till the certificates are issued to the students.
- 6.5 The clauses of this Agreement, which by nature are intended to survive termination of this Agreement and shall remain in effect after such termination.

7 AMENDMENT AND WAIVER

No Amendment for change hereof or addition hereto shall be effective or binding on either of the Parties hereto unless set in writing and executed by the respective duly authorized representatives of each of the Parties hereto. 

She started working as a co-therapist her son and is a qualified Special Educator certified by the Karnataka Parents' Association for Ment Retarded Citizens (KPAMRC). When she saw remarkable progress in her child with the techniques s used, she created a YouTube channel and blog to share her ideas and thoughts with other parents. S works as a Special Educator at Bubbles Centre for Autism, Bangalore.

Smrithy has presented her experiences at various forums including the International Conference Mumbai, National Conference at Jaipur and parent working groups in Hyderabad and Bangalore. S helps and motivates parents across the globe and guides them on steps to be taken at various sta

of their child's development.

To her credit, Smrithy has researched Augmentative Alternative Communication (AAC) techniques and pioneered customised use of Avaz India. She built communication skills using Avaz for her child, who is non-verbal. Smrithy belie that physical exercise should be an integral part of every intervention programme and has helped her son ace Roller Skati where he showed considerable interest. Her son, Advaith, won the State Level Gold Medal in Roller Skating for two conse tive years, 2017 and 2018 and was a Silver medallist at the Special Olympic Bharath Karnataka in 2017. 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Gandhiji's Favourite Bhajans in ISL

It was for the first time in the Indian Sign Language that the deaf students of the National Institute of Speech and Hearing performed the Indian Sign Language version of the favourite Bhajans of Mahatma Gandhi on his 150th birth anniversary celebrations on October 2, 2019. A video CD of the same was also released by the Director of Social Justice Department and NISH Ms. Sheeba George IAS handing over the video CD to Dr K.G. Satheesh Kumar, Director of the Centre of Assistive Technology and Innovations (CATI) at NISH. 63 deaf students performed the Mudranatanm version of Gandhiji's favourite Bhajans and also the national song, 'Vande Mataram.

The bhajans included 'Ekla Chalore' written by Tagore, 'Vaishnav Janatho' by Narasinh Mehta and 'Reghupathi Raghjav Rajaram' by Lakshmanacharya. The ISL version was produced at NISH with the participation of 63 deaf students.

In the run up to Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary, 45 students of NISH used sign language to present three of his favourite songs and bhajans.

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Forty five students stood in three lines as three songs, famously adored by Mahatma Gandhi, played. The students, wearing orange, white and green – the colours of the Indian flag – adeptly expressed the lyrics in sign language. A video of the same will be officially released on Gandhi Jayanti in Thiruvananthapuram. The presentation is called Satyameva Jayate.


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It was a teacher named Silvy Maxi Mena who trained 45 deaf students from the National Institute of Speech and Hearing to present three of Gandhi's favourite songs and bhajans in sign language. "On his 150th birth anniversary this year, we wanted to do something special. The three bhajans we chose are *Ekla Chalo Re* by Rabindranath Tagore, *Vaishnav Janto* by Narsini Mehta, and *Raghupati Raghav Raja Ram* by Lakshmanacharya. It was a challenge translating these, especially *Ekla Chalo Re* which is in Bengali. But the students were so talented; and they enjoyed working on this together," Silvy says.

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The idea came to her when she reckoned that this was a way for the students to understand more about Gandhi's principles. "They have very little reading material about the father of the nation and know just the basics. The lyrics of these songs also give them a better understanding of his principles," Silvy says.



The students who performed these songs are aged between 17 and 21 years, and are pursuing Higher Education Foundation Program and degree courses. Students and teachers at NISH helped with the camera and other technical work. "Executive director Samuel N Mathew has been very supportive," Silvy adds.

This is not the first such unique idea that Silvy has executed. Three years ago, she got the students at NISH to perform a classical dance using sign language as mudras. "It was called Mudra Nadanam," she says . Another time, she got them to perform the national anthem and Vande Matharam in sign language.
